Who can be a Reviewer?

- ◆ Patients and Carers

- ◆ Commissioners

For professional reviewers, this counts as CPD and you will need to have 2 years experience working at the role you will be undertaking during the review.

Reviewer travel costs will be met.

If required, rail or overnight accommodation will be arranged by WMQRS

- ◆ You would like to help NHS organisations improve their services
- ◆ You have the ability to commit to and work as an equal member of the review team
- ◆ To improve your own service: 80% of reviewers say they made improvements to their own service as a result of the experience
- ◆ To help you gain experience in quality assurance for your own service
- ◆ It's enjoyable working in a team visiting another service
