Main Purpose

- To be a member of the Sickle Cell Society (SCS) Panel of Medical and Scientific Advisers and provide up to date, high quality nursing and scientific advice and support about all aspects of sickle cell disease (SCD)/Haemoglobinopathies to the SCS Chief Executive and/or staff.
- To build and maintain effective/cordial relationships with SCS staff and external stakeholders such as Nursing and Midwifery Council, Royal College of Nursing, Industry, NHS England, Integrated Care Systems, Department of Health and Social Care, Public Health England and National Institute of Clinical Excellence.

Key Responsibilities

- To provide nursing advice, assistance and professional expertise on all appropriate nursing related matters on SCD/Haemoglobinopathies to the SCS as part of the organisation's team of Medical and Scientific Advisers
- To support the SCS Chief Executive and other staff on nursing matters such as clinical trials/clinical research, SCD standards of care
- Review and sign off SCS material which includes nursing/clinical advice/narrative
- To support any relevant in house SCS staff training on nursing/clinical aspects of SCD/Haemoglobinopathies
- Where appropriate, provide nursing insights and expert knowledge for the development of SCS responses to consultation on NICE, HTA assessments or Appraisals
- Develop and maintain good relationships with SCD patients, families as well as key external organisations
